Dear St. John's Members and Friends,

God's blessings to you all! This is Pr. Mark Wimmer and I have been asked by the Bishop's office to serve as your Bridge Pastor at St. John's. My time of service will be the next few months during which time I will walk with you through the beginning of your transition in pastoral leadership. My responsibilities will primarily be in the leading of worship on Sundays (along with Pr. Tom Lichner on an occasional Sunday), visitation as needed, and consulting in the call/transition process as it begins to unfold.

The calling of new pastoral leadership will take many months. It involves the gathering of information about the parish, your community setting, the resources available for ministry, and the development of a vision for ministry. All these factors will determine the type of pastor you will seek. The number of pastors available for call is not great causing this congregation and others like you to be nimble in your thinking and open to new ways of staffing in providing the pastoral partnership you seek.

This will be a time of challenge for St. John's. In my limited time here though, I have seen the presence of good and solid leadership both in the membership volunteers as well as the staff. You enjoy a spirited worship and even laugh at my humorous reflections! All positive attributes that will aide you greatly in the time ahead.

I shall be in consistent contact with the Bishop's office about "next steps" and will communicate frequently with your leadership. I will be in the office most Wednesdays and am available for conversation and questions as schedule allow. Please call on me if I can be of any assistance.


Please be assured that visitation and Home Communion are always available at St. John's. Contact us if you or a family member desires the sacrament or a visit.

- We received a phone call with a request for a "Town Hall" meeting Melissa Sullivan is advocating for homeowners of manufactured homes and the rise of lot rent affecting over 3,000 families in Lehigh County. They have spoken with LAMPa (Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania) who suggested reaching out to local churches. We need more information, and it is likely our multipurpose room is not large enough.

Pastor Jean Huber joined us following the meeting. She gave us a list of what is involved in the call process. Of the 16 steps we are at step one. She has found an interim pastor available to start on August 31, 2025 and end at the end of November. The council will meet with this pastor (Pastor Mark Wimmer) on Monday, August 25 to discuss a contract.

Pastor Huber also discussed a new idea 6261. It involves grouping 6 small congregations, 2 pastors, 6 licensed lay ministers, and 1 deacon. A presentation of this will be held on September 9 at St. James Coopersburg at 7:00. Some council members will attend to get more information.

A motion was made by Neola, seconded by Sara, to close the meeting. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

# Special Council Meeting - August 25, 2025 at 7:00 PM

A special council meeting was held to meet with prospective bridge pastor, Pastor Mark Wimmer. All council members were present except Lynn McMillen. President Mike Divers opened the meeting and Neola led us in prayer.

Pastor Wimmer comes to us with 45 years in the ministry with a varied background. He is presently retired from full time ministry. He is married with grown children and grandchildren. He and his wife Lisa reside in Bethlehem. Pastor Wimmer and his wife also enjoy acting as tour guides from late November through early January for the Moravian historical area in Bethlehem.

Pastor Wimmer spent time getting to know the individual members of council and what areas each served the congregation. He asked what we expected of him, and he shared what we could expect from him. He would be able to give us 12-15 hours/week (including Sunday morning) for \$50 an hour. Some milage would also be requested. His job is to keep the status quo until we get an interim pastor. He is not looking to

change anything, just keep us going. He said his preaching style is narrative, laced with humor, and may include current events that are tied in.

At the end of the meeting, he said he would be happy to spend about 3 months with us, ending at the end of November. He led us in prayer and left us to discuss his offer.

After some discussion Neola made a motion, seconded by Curtis, to enter into a contract with Pr. Wimmer. The motion carried unanimously.

President Mike Divers will be in touch with Pastor Wimmer to set the details. He would begin September 14 and end in November. Dates Pastor Lichner has already promised would be negotiated in the contract.

A motion to close the meeting was made by Mike, seconded by Curtis.
