Mike Herman called the meeting to order. Pastor Wimmer led us in prayer.

Council Meeting Minutes of September 8th Neola made a motion, seconded by Stacey, to approve the minutes of the September 8th meeting. The motion carried.

Treasurer/Finance Report (August 2025) Carla made a motion, seconded by Lynn, to approve the financial reports. The motion carried.

President's Report:

Council openings begin in November. The following members are going off: Carla Malantonio, Mike Herman, and Neola Geschel. Matt Kressin will accept a second term. On a motion made by Curtis, seconded by Sara, council elections will take place next meeting, November 17th.

Pastor's Report:


